Metal Roof Rebate

Homeowners that purchase a qualifying metal roof through Dec. 31, 2010 can receive a 30% tax rebate up to \$1,500. Additional information regarding metal roof tax rebates can be seen at the Energy Star website at <http://www.energystar.gov> and/or consult with your tax advisor.

Homeowners who install qualified energy-efficient improvements to their home are eligible for tax credit savings up to \$500 in accordance with The Energy Policy Act of 2005 as well. “Qualified” metal roofing materials must have appropriate pigmented coatings that meet Energy Star Program requirement.

Saving Energy

Metal roofing reduces energy consumption significantly. Summer cooling costs are reduced because metal roofing reflects the sun’s rays. Winter heating costs are reduced because metal roofing provides a tight seal and insulating effect to keep heat from escaping through the attic during cold winters. You win with lower utility bills, and the world wins by using less energy.

Saving Resources

In addition to saving money and energy, metal roofing saves valuable resources, which we know are limited. Again, metal roofing leads the way:

- Eliminating unnecessary landfill additions – since new metal roofing sheets can be placed directly over old shingles, waste in our landfills is reduced
- Longevity – Metal roofs last longer than traditional asphalt 40 years vs 15 years – reducing the need for additional resources
- Recyclable materials – Metal roofing is comprised of 25% recyclable materials and are 100% recyclable
